Mr. Miyasaka had begun the excavation research from Showa 15 (1940). The research was carried out with the academic advices by some professors and some associations of archaeology who had come and joined this research of the Jomon settlement. Those advices made progress with the newer knowledge and newer way of excavation.

The excavation research had been continued by Mr. Miyasaka's effort until Showa 17 (1942), when the WW2/ Pacific War became fierce and the daily life in Japan went much harder.

Finally, after the war, the result of the research was published, and was highly appreciated among the archaeologists of Japan as the very first study of the prehistoric Jomon settlement in Japan.
